How to write a story

At the Royal Mint we are trying to be more sustainable to help build a better future. What do you think a better future for the climate will look like?

What do you need to think about before you begin writing?

Purpose

We have given you the topic of 'sustainable futures' to base your story around, but what do you want your story to be about? How do you want the reader to feel? Maybe you want them to feel happy and hopeful for the future, or excited by your story, or perhaps you want them to feel sad. You could write a funny story to make the reader laugh. Once you have decided what the purpose of your story will be, think how you can achieve this and what words you can use in your writing to set the mood.

Setting

Where do you want to set your story? Where is the action going to happen? Is your story going to take place somewhere you know or somewhere you've never been? You could imagine a whole new made-up world.

You can set your story anywhere you like but it must make sense for your plot and purpose.

Character

Who is the star of your story? Is it you or someone you have made up, or is it a real person? It could be a historical figure. Maybe there are lots of people in your story. It doesn't have to be a person; it could be an animal like the ones on the Royal Mint coins, or an alien from another planet. Or it could even be a story about an object like a coin!

Structure

When you write a story you want there to be a beginning, middle and an end.

BEGINNING
this is where you set the
scene and introduce
your characters.

THE MIDDLE this is where the action happens.

THE END
this is where you
want to conclude
your story.
